MEMORANDUM FOR SEE DISTRIBUTION

SUBJECT: General Order Regarding Off-Installation Curfew

1. Effective immediately, this order rescinds all previous orders and guidance regarding the off-installation curfew.
2. Applicability. This order applies in the Republic of Korea to the individuals listed below:
 - a. All active-duty members of the United States (U.S.) Armed Forces (including active duty, active duty for training, and annual training) who are assigned to United States Forces Korea (USFK);
 - b. All individuals subject to U.S. military justice jurisdiction under Article 2(a), Uniform Code of Military Justice (UCMJ);
 - c. All U.S. citizen civilian employees of the Department of Defense (DOD) and nonappropriated fund instrumentalities supporting USFK;
 - d. All dependents of U.S. service members and U.S. citizen civilian employees of the DOD and nonappropriated fund instrumentalities supporting USFK; and
 - e. All DoD Invited Contractor employees as defined by Article XV, subparagraph 1 of the ROK-US SOFA, all personnel afforded SOFA status as Technical Representatives under the ROK-US SOFA, and their dependents.
3. Military Purpose and Necessity. Conditions in the Korean area of operations make it prudent to limit off-installation activities during late-night and early-morning hours for reasons of force protection, safety, good order, discipline, and optimum readiness.
4. Off-Installation Curfew. An off-installation curfew is in effect from 0001 until 0500 daily. Service members must be on a military installation; in a private residence; or in their place of lodging for the evening, which may include a hotel room off the installation. Travel during curfew hours directly from a military installation or event site to off-installation personal residence is authorized provided it follows (1) attendance at an on-installation activity, (2) an installation sponsored MWR/recreational event, or (3) a unit sponsored recreational event that was approved by the first O-6 in the chain of command.

SUBJECT: General Order Regarding Off-Installation Curfew

5. This is a Punitive Order. Persons subject to the UCMJ who fail to comply with the provisions of this order are subject to punishment under the UCMJ, as well as to adverse administrative action and other adverse action authorized by applicable laws or regulations. Persons not subject to the UCMJ who fail to comply with the provisions of this order may be subject to adverse administrative sanctions, including, but not limited to, revocation of privileges as authorized by applicable law and regulation.

6. Command Responsibilities. Unit commanders will ensure that all personnel under their control and their dependents understand this order and that violations may be punished. Commanders will exercise discretion when enforcing this order. Commanders, O-6 and above, have the authority to impose further restrictions as deemed necessary. Authority to waive or otherwise modify the prohibitions of this order is not further delegated and remains with the Commander, USFK. In addition, the Assistant Chief of Staff Acquisition Management, USFK, is responsible for informing DoD invited contractors/technical representatives and their dependents of this order.

7. This amended order is effective immediately, and will remain in effect until rescinded or modified by the Chief of Staff, USFK, or higher headquarters.
